IX. ADJOURNMENT

The Council of the City of Parkersburg met in regular session Tuesday, May 22, 2018 at 7:30 PM in the Council Chambers on the second floor of the Municipal Building at One Government Square, Parkersburg, WV, and joined in the Lord's Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance prior to the beginning of the meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Council President, John Reed, who presided over the meeting.

The Clerk noted those members attending as Councilmen Dave McCrady, Sharon Kuhl, Bob Mercer, Eric Barber, JR Carpenter, Mike Reynolds, Zach Stanley, Jeff Fox, and John Reed.

MINUTES – With no additions or corrections, the minutes from the Council meeting held May 1, 2018 were approved by unanimous consent.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE – Mayor Tom Joyce introduced a new member of the Mayor's Youth Advisory Commission, Ms. Gretchen Dowler from PHS. He also commended students from the Caperton Center and Wood County Technical Center who designed and built a new shelter at Southwood Park, close to the waterslide. City employees helped with the project also.

Mayor Joyce distributed maps to City Council showing our paving and slab replacement projects for this season.

DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT REPORT – the 2017 Annual Report from the Parkersburg Development Department was received and filed by Council, upon motion made by Mr. Barber and seconded by Mr. Mercer, and adopted by unanimous vote.

PUBLIC FORUM – Ms. Emily Suzanne Larking, Executive Director of the Family Crisis Intervention Center, told Council they have tried for a very long time to raise funds to fix a major water leak in their basement, but this winter the water came through the wall into their basement, and shop vacs are not doing the job, she said. They have received an estimate of \$30,000.00.

Ms. Debbie Jeffrey, 4012 10th Avenue, Parkersburg, WV announced the 3rd Annual National Night Out on Tuesday, August 7, 2018, a free event at Point Park for the community and police departments to mingle with safety services, and invited everyone to attend.

Councilman Carpenter asked to speak, and President Reed announced this was a time for the public to speak.

MOTION - Mr. Barber moved, seconded by Mr. Fox, to allow Mr. Carpenter to speak and the motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

Councilman Carpenter stated that citizens are participating in the application process in the code and housing divisions, and it seems like a lot of people are taking advantage of our programs.

RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING MAYOR JOYCE TO INITIATE A TRAFFIC IMPACT STUDY WITH THE WOOD - WASHINGTON - WIRT (WWW) INTERSTATEPLANNING COMMISSION TO ASSESS TRAFFIC IMPACTS RESULTING FROMPROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS ALONG MURDOCH AVENUE (RT., 14), BETWEEN24th STREET AND LAKEVIEW DRIVE CONSISTENT WITH WWWS LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN UPDATE FOR 2040

Whereas, the City of Parkersburg is committed to providing are residents and businesses with the best quality of life, and

Whereas, this includes assessing and making improvements to the City's transportation network, and

Whereas, several improvements have been proposed along Rt. 14, between 24th Street and Lakeview Avenue.

Whereas, said improvements could potentially reduce traffic congestion and mitigate safety issue relating to motorists traveling in the vicinity, and

Whereas, some proposed improvements are consistent with the Wood-Washington-Wirt Interstate Planning Commission's Long Range Transportation Plan Update for 2040, and

Whereas, the Wood-Washington-Wirt Interstate Planning Commission has agreed to commit \$40,000 toward a traffic study of the corridor, provided the City of Parkersburg contributes \$10,000, and

Whereas, the City's participation would be expensed from the Development Department's Contractual Services, Line Item #421-230-000.

Whereas, the City would collaborate with WWW to develop a scope of work and request for consultant proposals, as well as participate in the consultant selection process,

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Parkersburg hereby authorizes Mayor Joyce to initiate a traffic study, in conjunction with the Wood-Washington-Wirt Interstate Planning Commission to assess the impact of potential improvements along Route 14 consistent with WWW'S Long Range Transportation Plan Update for 2040.

MOTION - Mr. Reynolds moved, seconded by Mr. Mercer, to adopt the resolution.

When Mr. Carpenter asked how this study would improve Parkersburg, Mayor Joyce stated that parts of the lanes would be widened. The State DOH agrees there can be improvements, but they will not proceed with significant widening of lanes on Murdoch without a traffic study, and the DOH does not pay for traffic studies. There are private people who have paid in the past and the work was not done. The improvements would mean less traffic through the Beechwood area.

Mr. Yeager said it would impact how people move around that area, and does not know if it will include the traffic circle, since it will depend on the cost.

VOTE – the motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION FOR A MATCHING FUND GRANT FOR LITTER CONTROL

- WHEREAS, the City of Parkersburg recognizes the existence of a litter problem within the boundaries of the City of Parkersburg, and
- WHEREAS, the West Virginia Litter Control Program of 1985 provides matching grants of "litter control funds" through the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection for the purpose of establishing local litter control programs, and
- WHEREAS, having reviewed and considered West Virginia Administrative Regulations, Department of Environmental Protection, Title 33 Series 41.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Parkersburg hereby endorses and supports such a program for the City of Parkersburg as is indicated in the Application; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Parkersburg authorizes Mayor Tom Joyce to plan, budget, and apply for a matching grant not to exceed \$10,000, 50% of which would come from the Public Works Department Sanitation Division's Supplies Budget for Fiscal Year 2019 and the remaining 50% of which would come from the West Virginia Department of Environmental Protection if approved, which will be used to fund a fence and recycling bins for said program and being in accordance with the regulations governing use and expenditure of said funds.

MOTION -- Mr. Reynolds moved, seconded by Ms. Kuhl, to adopt the resolution, and the motion was adopted by unanimous vote.

Parkersburg City Council had previously allocated \$15,000 in FY14 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to the Parkersburg-Wood County Library to assist with ADA improvements during the construction of the South Parkersburg Branch at 1807 Blizzard Dr. These funds were not utilized. More recently, the Parkersburg-Wood County Library intended to repurpose these funds to assist in the renovations of their library at 3100 Emerson Ave. These funds were intended to make ADA Improvements to the building. Again, this project never materialized due to strict construction schedules. Upon completion of the libraries renovations, funding limitations did not allow important improvements to the young adult reading area. Furniture and technology equipment to this area of the library will qualify as an eligible activity through the CDBG Program because the library is located in a low-moderate income census

MOTION – Mr. Stanley moved, seconded by Mr. Mercer, to adopt the resolution, and the motion was adopted by majority vote with all members voting "yes" with the exception of Mr. Barber and Mr. Reynolds, who voted "no".

This activity is for administration costs associated with running the CDBG Program. The original budget amount for this activity was \$153,887.18, and proposed to amend to \$103,887.18 to fund other activities. This revision will have no adverse impact on the administration of the CDBG programs.

Family Crisis Intervention Center - Facility Improvements

FCIC is one of 14 licensed domestic violence shelters in West Virginia. A necessary repair must be made to the buildings foundation to correct longstanding leaks. Repairs are necessary to continue providing life-saving emergency services to victims/survivors of domestic and sexual violence.

Please note; this project would qualify under CDBG activity Public Facilities & improvements 570.201(c) Code 03C Homeless

MOTION - Ms. Kuhl moved, seconded by Mr. Mercer, to adopt the resolution.

Ms. Kuhl asked why we had budgeted \$50,000.00 when an estimate had been \$30,000.00. Development Director, Rickie Yeager, stated that the estimate did not include David/Bacon wages, which have to be used with federal funds, and out of an abundance of caution, he is asking for \$50,000.00 to be sure. Bidding procedures will be followed, he said.

Mr. McCrady said he would like to see engineering studies before we spend that much, and also thought the public works department could help. Mayor Joyce assured Council that this is not water coming from the street – it is coming through the ground, and not a public works problem.

We should be working with better numbers, Mr. Reynolds stated. Mr. Yeager said this was an emergency request, and Mr. Santer said the money had to be in place before we ask for bids. There are no other CD funds to assist with this problem.

MOTION – Mr. Carpenter moved, seconded by Mr. Reynolds, to refer the revision to the Finance Committee, and the motion was adopted by majority vote with all members voting "yes" with the exception of Ms. Kuhl, Mr. Barber and Mr. Reed, who voted "no".

It is for 52 cents per hour increase.

Personnel Director, Ms. Wallace, pointed out the additional duties this employee has performed for a while, when asked by Mr. Carpenter.

The Personnel Director had all the employees review their job descriptions, Mayor Joyce stated. Jobs evolve and it is not uncommon.

Mr. Barber asked where we were on doing a new study for the employees, and Ms. Wallace said we were getting quotes.

President Reed stated this was nothing personal, but we had said we would be doing a comprehensive study, and we should not single an employee out. We should wait for the study, he said.

Mr. Stanley asked if this employee was not classified correctly, and Ms. Wallace said it was a mis-classification. Mr. Stanley said when we know it is wrong, we should not delay. Mr. Reed said there were other discrepancies in other departments.

Mayor Joyce said we were in the process of doing the study, but this one is easy to reclassify. The duties are out of line. There will be no guarantees that when we do the study that we will have the ability to fix them, but we will know where we stand. He suspects we will find we can't afford to bring them up to market rate. This reclassification is needed, he said.

Mr. Reynolds asked about the increase in pay, and Ms. Wallace said it would be \$5,734.00 more per year. This is the only supervisor who is not in a salary position, and the overtime will be more than \$7,200.00 this fiscal year. We would save money to make her salary, she said.

The employee gets 3 hours overtime when called out, even for working 30 minutes. This is an employee at the Memorial Bridge and the system has to work, and this is the audit check for traffic going across the bridge. Other employees are part time, and cannot assume those duties.

Mayor Joyce said the biggest part is re-setting the system, which cannot wait until the next day. The audit is clear and very important that the system is working to generate a good report. If we are not counting cars every shift, we are non-compliant. This is a management position and should have been looked at before. There is no abuse of the overtime, he said.

VOTE – the motion was adopted by majority vote with all members voting "yes" with the exception of Mr. Fox, who voted "no". (Ms. Kuhl absent and not voting on this ordinance)

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES: Manages and supervises the Memorial Bridge Division of the Public Works Department. Requires initiative and independent judgment in carrying out the duties of the position within established policies, regulations and procedures. Duties include, but are not limited to the following:

- 13) Prepares and maintains a variety of complex reports and records;
- 14) Balances receipts and prepares deposits; and
- 15) Performs related work as required.
- 16) Available for after-hours call outs.

Reports directly to the Public Works Director.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Knowledge of the following: laws, ordinances, policies, and procedures applicable to the work assigned; methods and techniques of effective supervision and management. Skills: planning, organizing and directing through subordinate staff, the efficient and effective delivery of services; evaluating operations, procedures, and policies and implementing improvements; promoting and enforcing safe work practices; using a personal computer and software applications appropriate for work assignments; ensuring that information is properly identified and/or accurately reported. Abilities: plan, schedule, and implement assigned activities in a timely and effective manner; supervise employees; make decisions about assigned activities independently within the confines of the laws, ordinances, policies, and procedures impacting the department; communicate effectively and diplomatically, orally and in writing; establish and maintain effective working relationships with fellow employees, representatives of other organizations and the general public.


